Care Home Advice Service	Amended	Amendments include allowing telephone support if care home cannot be entered
Common Ailments Service	Active	Remote consultations where appropriate
Discharge Medicines Review (DMR)	Active	Remote consultations where appropriate
Emergency Contraception	Active	Remote consultations where appropriate
Emergency Medicines Supply	Active	Remote consultations where appropriate
Just in case box service	Active	NA
Medicines Use Review (MUR)	Suspended until 31st March 2021	NA
Naloxone	Active	N/A
Needle Exchange Service	Active	Clients have been encouraged to use WCADA and Barod to reduce footfall in pharmacies. For those using pharmacies it is suggested that they are encouraged to take ample quantities of needle exchange supplies and that supplies are not limited (regardless of whether they have brought returns to the pharmacy, although this should continue to be encouraged). This will reduce the need for return visits to the pharmacy.

Palliative care/Enoxaparin drugs Access service	Active	SBUHB has expanded the palliative care service and updated SLAs will have been sent to contractors
Seasonal Influenza Service	Active	Offsite vaccinations
Smoking Cessation Level 2	Active	Revised process from HMQ which includes the provision of letters that last for 12 weeks instead of 2 weeks (maximum of 4 weeks supply to made at any one time)
Smoking Cessation Level 3	Active	CO monitoring requirement suspended. Self-reported 4 week quits accepted. Remote consultations where appropriate and supplies to representatives where appropriate
Sore Throat Test and Treat	Suspended – currently under review	NA
Supervised Administration Service	Active	Guidance has been issued by SBUHB regarding changes to how CDAT is operating including dealing with supervision patients who need to isolate
